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# Introduction

**Organization Lessons.** This tab has all the digital lessons that have been mapped to your district's curriculum. It is an open library, meaning that you have access to lessons for all subjects and grade levels. Your students will have access only to lessons that you assign to them.

To find a lesson, you can search by keyword, narrow by subject, and/or narrow by grade:

- Narrow by subject is the quickest way for high school courses.
- For grades K-8, you may want to also narrow by grade level or keyword search. Just type part of the lesson or unit name and press the Enter or Return key.
- If you can't find a lesson, try hitting Reset and restarting your search.

# Differentiation

#### **By Setting**

- Group students by language proficiency.
- Depending on the activity and reading level of the group, choose either individual or paired work time so students can use peers as supports.
- For your most struggling learners, use this time to do a small group pull-out, with you as their main support.

By Assignment

- Each time you assign a lesson, you can assign it to specific students.
- For your struggling learners, start with Level 1 and make all the activities required when you assign the lesson. Be sure to provide enough time and instruction for them to complete the full lesson!
- For more proficient readers, mark some activities as optional so that they have permission to move to Level 2 faster. Or, have them spend more time on your classroom materials during individual or small group work time.

#### **By Individual Student**

• You can copy a lesson and customize it for each student! Before you do, we recommend taking our PD 201: Differentiated Instruction to learn the tools.
